Here are the beginning practices listed in the calendar for the first week of Lent:

March 20 Labor exploitation is often tied up in sustaining our current levels of consumption. Take the Human Slavery Footprintsurvey at (slaveryfootprint.org). Consider ways to decrease your participation in modern-day slavery.

March 21 Do you know what watershed you live in? Find out, explore, and consider connecting with a local watershed stewardship organization: https://mywaterway.epa.gov

March 22 Is World Water Day. Observed annually, today we recognize how people around the world are affected by water issues: www.un.org/en/events/waterday

March 23 Refugee displacement and hunger relate to damage to God's creation. Spend some time reflecting on how issues of care for God's creation relate to your faith community's anti-hunger, peacemaking, and refugee resettlement ministries.

March 25 Say a prayer for God's threatened and endangered creatures. Consider sharing an **Endangered** Species coloring book for children to color.

Together Colorado Action Opportunity: We all need a safe, stable, and affordable place to call home. But today, this sacred space- home- is at risk for our neighbors who live in mobile home parks. Corporate landlords are buying Coloradan mobile home parks, neglecting maintenance and upkeep, and jacking up rent, making immense profit while forcing out hundreds of residents and breaking up lifelong communities. HB22-1287: Protections for Mobile Home Park Residents will keep people in their homes by expanding opportunities for residents to stay in their communities when their parks go up for sale, establishing sensible annual limits on lot rent increases, and increasing accountability for park owners. Emergency response to Ukraine war



As the violence in Ukraine continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work. Our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.
