The Whole Inhabited Earth in the Season of Creation 2022

"Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." (Ex. 3:5) We are now in the Season of Creation, an ecumenical movement which will last September 1 - October 4. The symbol selected for this year is the burning bush - a holy fire that neither consumes nor destroys. Resources to aid your reflection and action in this season can be found below. • Three Garden for Wildlife Tips: (1) Bats are an iconic symbol of the Halloween season, but in reality, these flying mammals are anything but scary. They provide critical insect control and some are even pollinators. Learn more about them and about ways you can help HERE. (2) Are you scared of bees and wasps? What about bats? How about spiders? Naturalist David Mizejewski talks about these and other so-called "scary" wild animals that really aren't so scary once you get to know them. He'll explain their natural behaviors, why they're important and how to avoid any problems with them. Check out his video HERE. (3) Owls are incredible and elusive creatures. They usually need a little coaxing to come around, but once they do it is worth the effort. Once you've made things homey for owls, prepare for a mutually rewarding relationship.
