

- The Matthew 25 group of the Presbytery has compiled a resource to educate Matthew 25 congregations about the opportunity to address our vision of eradicating systemic poverty through a November 2022 ballot measure, Proposition 123. If adopted by voters, Proposition 123 would expand affordable housing by designating .01 percent of tax revenue annually collected to be used toward addressing the crisis of insufficient affordable housing in Colorado. The measure does not raise taxes, but rather allows Coloradans to address this problem in a sustainable way by budgeting funds specifically towards affordable housing solutions. A more detailed description of Proposition 123 is available HERE and includes links to the full text of the Proposition and to the League of Women Voters' discussion of the ramifications of the measure, if adopted.

Colorado State Historic Grant Matching Funds

The restoration work on the West Facade is underway with architectural drawing and paperwork being prepared by our grant manager Shannon Stage of Historic Denver, and our architect Natalie Lord. The team also includes Jonas Landes & Graham Johnson of Spectrum General Contractors; & Jane & Phil Watkins of Watkins Stained Glass. Debbie Yeager is representing the Church community. We anticipate the pre-construction meeting to take place by the first week of November. This meeting will include representatives from Spectrum General Contractors, Danielle Lewon, Historic Specialist with the State Historical Fund, Shannon Stage of Historic Denver, and Debbie and Sonya of CHPC.

• A Message form Richard O'Brian with CO Lights Out: "As this fall bird migration season winds down, it seems important to review our progress and our future plans. We've made great progress with public awareness: nocturnal bird migration is now an issue to millions of

Coloradans. Many people are now aware that our artificial light hurts migrating birds, and that 80% of birds who migrate, migrate at night. Thanks to researchers, we have a huge amount of data about nocturnal bird migration in Colorado. At Colorado State University Aeroecolab.com, we have migration forecasts for Colorado. BirdCast's Migration Dashboard provides excellent live radar data about migrating birds. [Let's] continue our efforts by



telling people about the issue, and what can be done to help. Now is the time to plan projects to upgrade to shielded outdoor fixtures. Correctly targeting and shielding outdoor lights can allow birds to navigate using the natural night sky, while still providing needed lighting to people on the ground." To learn more visit Lights Out Colorado. The Birdcast Migration Dashboard will continue forecasting bird migration across the country until November 15th.
