- The Social/Racial Justice Film Series continues Friday, February 3 at First Universalist Church of Denver, 4101 E. Hampden Ave, Denver 80222 with the showing of The Letter, a film by Laudato Si' Movement's featuring Pope Francis as the protagonist and among five leaders representing the voices of Indigenous people, the youth, the poor and the wildlife of our planet. The event will be a Snacks & Sweets Potluck! At 6:30 p.m. we will meet for snacks and sweets, and then enjoy the documentary. Green First, the First Universalist "green team" brings this film to our Film series. They will help us with a discussion after the film and give us ideas how to take meaningful and impactful actions moving forward.

This film tells the story about the Pope's call to care for our planet. In 2015, Pope Francis wrote Laudato Si', a letter to the world confronting the looming calamity of human impact on Earth and ourselves. It is one of the most ambitious and revolutionary papal statements in history and outlines the most critical environmental and social issues that we collectively face. The film features often unheard voices as well as U.S. scientists in a global dialogue about our planet. As Pope Francis states in the film, "The cries of the earth and the poor can't go on. Nature is screaming stop. It's like a choir, we have to sing together."
