And, equal access to education is critical to the development of nations. Over the past forty years, the international community has worked to increase access to basic education and has seen some progress due to these efforts. But education disparities based on gender continue to be one of the most significant challenges in education globally, especially in low-income countries. To help address the problem, a bipartisan group of Senators and Representatives introduced the "Keeping Girls in School Act" (H.R.4134 and S.2276) in Congress. 

- **During the 2022 Colorado Legislative Session,** Together Colorado lobbied our state elected officials to advance our human dignity legislative agenda. You can read Together Colorado's 2022 Legislative Summary **HERE**.

- Eyes to the Skies! In twilight on Saturday and Sunday evening, look west for the waxing crescent Moon. Left of the Moon is Regulus, and above the Moon is slightly fainter Algieba, Gamma Leonis. Like last month, they form an isosceles (two-sides-equal) triangle. Binoculars help reveal the color difference between the two stars. Click on the picture on the right to learn about more astronomical events to watch for this week.
