• Zero Fare Transit in August! Our friends at 350 Colorado are sharing the good news that in August, across the state, we have the opportunity to ride RTD buses, MMT, GET, Poudre Express, light rail, paratransit, the HOP, Accessaride, trains to airport and more for free! RTD will offer zero fares across the entire system as part of the Zero Fare for Better Air initiative. This collaborative, statewide initiative is made possible by Colorado Senate Bill 22-180, the ozone season transit grant program in partnership with the Colorado Energy Office. Additionally, the long-distance intercity "Bustang" routes are 50% off from July 1 to September 5.





- Additional tools for using public transit: Plot your routes now for all of your usual destinations: use your maps app—it's easy! The RTD app is also extremely useful! Or you can plan trips or research routes by visiting the agency's website, where you can use the Trip Planner app, access schedules or sign up for Service Alerts. Next Ride provides realtime vehicle information. To ask questions of RTD during normal business hours (6 a.m.-6 p.m.), call Customer Care at 303-299-6000.
