Colorado State Historic Grant Matching Funds

The restoration work on the West Facade is underway with architectural drawing and paperwork being prepared by our grant manager Shannon Stage of Historic Denver, and our architect **Natalie Lord.** The team also includes Jonas Landes & Graham Johnson of Spectrum General Contractors; & Jane & Phil Watkins of Watkins Stained Glass. Debbie Yeager is representing the Church community. We anticipate the pre-construction meeting to take place by the first week of November. This meeting will include representatives from Spectrum General Contractors, Danielle Lewon, Historic Specialist with the State Historical Fund, Shannon Stage of Historic Denver, and Debbie and Sonya of CHPC.

The current work is made possible by a grant from the Colorado State Historic Society with matching funds coming from your generous donations - thank you!





• When a National expert in Stained Glass visits Colorado what's on their list of places to see in addition to the Capitol Building and St. John's Cathedral? Why Capitol Heights of course! We were delighted to host Julie Sloan who was out from New York this past week gathering material for her newest book on Stained Glass. She was visiting special locations throughout Denver with Phil and Jane Watkins and made a special request to see our church stained glass. Debbie and Sonya were delighted to open up our building for her brief visit on Friday.

Julie Sloan has worked in stained glass since 1982 and is the author of Conservation of Stained Glass in America and many articles on stained glass history and conservation. She has been an adjunct professor of historic preservation at Columbia University since 1985. She was also adjunct professor at Salve Regina University in Newport, Rhode Island, in 2004, teaching The History of Stained Glass in America. She has lectured at Williams College and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and given seminars around the country.
