Over the winter months windows will be removed from the West Façade to be worked on in the Watkins studio.

Come spring, work will begin on the windows on site, masonry, and tower roof and parapets.

#### Paper Lanterns for Martinmas

The festival of Martinmas is celebrated on

November 11 and originated in France hundreds of years ago. Also called Saint Martin's Day, it is the feast day of Saint Martin of Tours who was a Roman solder, baptized as an adult, and



became a bishop in France. He is remembered for sharing his cloak with a beggar during a snowstorm to save him from the cold. To remember the warmth and kindness of St. Martin's spirit and to kindle such warmth and light in our own spirits here is a template for making star lanterns on page 2 and 4. Have fun!

SUPPLIES:

- > 2 large watercolor paintings
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue
- Craft knife
- Printed copy of the paper pentagon pattern

- **COVID Safety Protocol:** Council requests that members who test positive for COVID and attended mass (or another 10:30 community function) at a time when they may have been infectious to pass that information along to the Chair so that other members can be informed and supported.

## **Paper Lantern Instructions**

- 1. First you'll need to print the pentagon pattern (found on page 4), or draw your own pattern using your pencil and ruler. For a large lantern you'll want each side of the pentagon to be approximately 2" long. To make a smaller lantern each side should measure 1.25" long.
- 2. Trace the pentagon pattern on the back of your watercolor painting, repeating it a total of 11 times. Cut out each pentagon.
- 3. Use a ruler and pencil to mark the halfway point on each of the five sides of the pentagon. Next, draw a line from each halfway point to the next. These lines will be your fold lines.
- 4. Working on the unpainted side, use a ruler and craft knife to gently score along each of the fold lines, then fold the points towards the centre of the pentagon, creasing firmly.
- 5. When all eleven pentagons have been folded in this way you can begin constructing the lantern. Use a glue stick to stick the paper pentagons together. Work slowly, making sure each one is correctly aligned and attached securely before moving on to the next one.
- 6. Start at the bottom of the lantern and work upwards. Each folded point overlaps the pentagon next to it on all sides, creating a star shape in the centre of the pentagon. Attach five pentagons to the base pentagon and to each other, creating the bottom of the lantern.
- 7. To create the top of the lantern, first take your remaining five pentagons and glue down one of the folded points to its unpainted side. These folded edges will become the top edge of the lantern. Now attach these pentagons to the bottom layer of the lantern and to each other, working slowly and making sure they are attached securely.
- 8. Using a battery operated tea light inside the paper lanterns works really well. When the tea light is illuminated your lantern will glow with beautiful colorful stars, the perfect addition to your Martinmas celebration and a beautiful centerpiece for your table over the cold, dark months of winter. Use a hole punch and add string to carry yours along on your lantern parade.
