Children's Ministry

Easy beeswax pumpkin candles

Make a well for your candle by carving out the stem of your pumpkin and scooping out the seeds.

Place your beeswax in a glass jar and place it in your pot of hot water. Stir occasionally until the wax has fully melted.

If making your own wick, cut a length of cotton twine and attach a paper clip to each end. Lower the twine into the melted wax and let it sit until the cotton is fully saturated with wax. Pull it out slowly, pulling it taut so it dries straight. Once fully dry, cut to the appropriate length.

Place your wick in the center of your pumpkin and pour the wax into the carved well, leaving a little space at the top. Support your wick by holding it in place or tying it with additional twine. Let sit until hardened completely.

Your pumpkin candles are ready to enjoy!

SUPPLIES:

- Miniature pumpkins
- Beeswax pellets or bars
- > Pre-made candle wicks or cotton twine
- > Sharp knife
- Glass jar
- Pot of hot water

Advent Resources November 27 - December 24

- The Interfaith Immigration Coalition (IIC) has created the toolkit *Preparing Welcome*, an Advent devotional for immigrant justice. The devotional journeys through the four weeks of Advent, beginning November 27, up to Christmas day.
 - **♦ Week 1, November 27** | Waiting for Violence to End
 - **♦ Week 2, December 4** | Waiting for Permanent Protections
 - **♦** Week 3, December 11 | Waiting for Water in the Wilderness
 - **❖** Week 4, December 18 | Waiting for Family Reunification
 - **♦** Christmas, December 25 | Welcoming with Light!
- IIC has also prepared a *Winter toolkit* that highlights various holy days, holidays, and special events occurring this winter and ideas on how you can observe them. Created by the IIC Holy Days & Holidays Working Group, this interfaith toolkit highlights holy days, holidays, and special events occurring this winter and how you can observe them. The hope is for this toolkit to serve as an educational resource as well as a tool to mobilize people of faith to embody their beliefs in seeking justice this season. Some of the early events highlighted in the toolkit are:
 - ❖ Hope for the Holidays Campaign: Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS) is proud to run its eighth-annual Hope for the Holidays program which collects cards and gifts for distribution at immigration detention centers across the country, sharing holiday hope and joy with individuals and families seeking safety in the United States. We are invited to join LIRS in sharing hope and joy with some of our newest neighbors! To learn how to participate, download Hope for the Holidays 2022 Toolkit which has information on writing and sending cards. Note that this year, cards are due by December 2nd.

Last year, volunteers distributed over 16,000 cards to migrant families in detention centers across the country, as well as to individuals and families who were recently released from detention. Notably, the campaign provided more than 500 children's gifts – enough for every single migrant child in family detention centers in the country to open a special present over the holiday season.

- ❖ December 8, Bodhi Day is the precious day Buddhists celebrate Gautama Shakyamuni Buddha's Enlightenment, primarily in Mahayana Buddhist traditions. Although it is, perhaps, the most important day of the Buddhist calendar (celebrating the ultimate goal of the path, Enlightenment) it is a quiet day in most traditions and a time for contemplation, practice, and purification.
- Presbyterians for Earth Care (PEC) have created a Daily Advent devotional for 2022.
 The devotions are based on the Revised Common Lectionary texts and have a Creation Care Perspective.
