• **A Special Message from our Partner CHUM Church First Unitarian Society of Denver:** *Dear 1st Unitarian Denver friends; As of this moment, we have been contacted by the mayor's office and there is a very good chance that 1st Unitarian (FUSD) will be asked to temporarily house up to fifteen of the immigrants who arrived in Denver yesterday. The board has approved this, and we am awaiting further details from the city, hopefully no later than Thursday morning.*

We will also need a couple organizer-type people to manage scheduling of meals, cleanup, on-site staffing, etc. for the next week or so. We can do this! - **Wednesday, December 14th CFCU Vigils:** This coming Wednesday, the 14th, marks ten years since the gun violence at Sandy Hook took from us children and teachers, as so many other gun violence actions have done. As of this month we will have lost one million Americans to gun violence since Sandy Hook. Folks are gathering all around the country on the 14th to hold a prayerful vigil in remembrance and lament. Two gatherings are near to us with details listed below. We hope to be able to join friends from Colorado Faith Communities to End Gun Violence and from Colorado Ceasefire to stand in solidarity to mourn our losses and raise our voices for change. Please join a vigil, if you can, and if you are unable to do that, remember to be prayerful in this concern on the 14th.
 - ▶ **Messiah Community Church (1750 N. Colorado Blvd., across from City Park) invites folks to gather at 4:15 for prayer and then go street side at 4:30 to 5:30 to stand for the vigil, many holding signs.**
 - ▶ **Also, a vigil will be held at First Baptist Church (14th Ave. and Grant St.) from 4:30 to 5:30.**
