- **December 2022 Peace Offering:** It has been our practice during the month of December to collect a Peace Offering in support of the Peace Efforts of the PC(USA) as well as a local Colorado organization. This year Session has designated SafeHouse Denver as our local recipient. SafeHouse Denver serves survivors of domestic violence and their children through an Emergency Shelter, a non-residential Counseling & Advocacy Center and an Extended Stay Program. All of the adults, children and youth who come to SafeHouse Denver have access to a full range of bilingual programming, including individual counseling, group sessions, advocacy and safety planning. If you would like to participate in this offering you can do so in three ways:
- 1. Bring your Peace offering to the services on December 18th or 25th.
- 2. Mail an offering (designated "Peace Offering 2022") to the church (address below). If mailing a check, be sure it is in the mail to arrive by Friday, December 30th.
- 3. Finally, you can donate online at https://capheightspres.org/donations. Once you have entered a donation amount there will be a place to "write a note" and you can specify that your donation is for the "Peace Offering."

A Special Message from our Partner CHUM Church First Unitarian Society of Denver: Dear 1st Unitarian Denver friends; As of this moment, we have been contacted by the mayor's office and there is a very good chance that 1st Unitarian (FUSD) will be asked to temporarily house up to fifteen of the immigrants who arrived in Denver yesterday. The board has approved this, and we are awaiting further details from the city.

If this happens, we are going to need a significant number of volunteers to help with setting up cots and bedding, making and serving meals, and being on-site to help with whatever comes up, starting Thursday. We will also need a couple organizer-type people to manage scheduling of meals, cleanup, on-site staffing, etc. for the next week or so. We can do this! Children's Ministry

Christmas Snickerdoodle Cookies:

1 cup unsalted butter (softened at room temperature)

- $1 \frac{1}{2} \text{ cups sugar}$
- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- $2 \frac{3}{4} \text{ cup flour}$
- 1 1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt

Cinnamon-Sugar Mixture:

- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 Tablespoons cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Bring out a large mixing bowl and cream butter and sugar for 4-5 minutes until light and fluffy. Scrape the sides of the bowl and add the eggs and vanilla. Cream for a minute longer. Stir in flour, cream of tartar, baking soda, and salt. In a small bowl, stir together sugar and cinnamon. Roll into small smooth balls. Drop into the cinnamon-sugar mixture and coat well. Place on a parchment paperlined baking sheet. Bake for 9-11 minutes. Let cool for several minutes before removing from the pan. Pour a glass of milk or cocoa and enjoy!

- <u>Support for Recent Migrants</u>: The City of Denver has informed us that one of the best ways to quickly offer supports to the influx of migrants is to donate to these organizations working directly with them: Colorado Housing Asylum Network; Denver Community Church; Americans Friends Service Committee.
- <u>Sunday, January 29</u>: There will not be a Mass on the 29th of January, but instead, the 10:30 Catholic Community is invited to join Capitol Heights to celebrate their 127th Anniversary in a Service at 9:30 AM. After the service all are invited to participate in our first Social Service Sunday when we will have the "Rice and Bean Bag Breakdown."
- Dear 10:30 Community Members: There has been concern recently about whether we should reinstitute a requirement for masks while at CHPC. At this time, there is not a building-wide mandate for use of masks at 1100 Fillmore. A check of the CDC case rates for Denver County today shows rates as "Medium." CHPC is encouraging people who are at high risk to wear a high quality mask when indoors. With three serious viruses circulating currently, we would certainly encourage and strongly recommend mask usage at this time. Please continue to stay careful and considerate, and please do not attend services if you are symptomatic or know of a recent exposure. We will keep you apprised as to any changes in masking requests.
- **COVID Safety Protocol:** Council requests that members who test positive for COVID and attended mass (or another 10:30 community function) at a time when they may have been infectious to pass that information along to the Chair so that other members can be informed and supported.

- <u>A Message from the Colorado Council of Churches:</u> The City and County of Denver and the state of Colorado has asked us to help get out the word that they need emergency shelter space for the influx of migrants coming here from mainly Latin American countries. Migrants and asylum seekers have been arriving to Denver from the U.S. southwest border and other cities across the country for several months now, but the numbers we were seeing increased rapidly as of a week ago and continue to stay consistent. We are seeing primarily young men, but we also have women, children, and families present within our shelter system. Most of the children are under age 10. The majority speak Spanish.
