Children's Ministry

Gluten Free Ginger Snaps (Vegan):

- 1 ¹/₄ cup maple syrup
- 3 Tbsp coconut sugar
- 3 Tbsp melted coconut oil
- 2 Tbsp molasses
- 1 ¹/₄ tsp ground ginger
- 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 pinch ground nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/4 tsp sea salt
- 1 cup oat flour
- $1/2\ cup$ almond flour
- 1/4 cup arrowroot flour (also called arrowroot starch)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (176 C) and line two large baking sheets with parchment paper. In a medium mixing bowl, whisk together the maple syrup, coconut sugar, melted coconut oil, molasses, ginger, cinnamon, nutmeg, baking soda, and sea salt until well combined and smooth. Add in the oat flour, almond flour, and arrowroot starch and mix with a wooden spoon or spatula until the flours are completely incorporated. Your dough should feel sticky but not too tacky (sticking to your hands) or too dry (crumbly) and should hold its form. If the dough appears too dry, it likely just needs more mixing. Form the dough into a disc and place it in the refrigerator for 30 minutes to solidify. Once the dough has rested, place a sheet of parchment paper on a large cutting board or countertop. Dust it lightly with arrowroot starch then place the dough in the center, dust with more arrowroot starch, and place another sheet of parchment paper on top of the dough. Working from the center out, roll the dough into a large circle about 1/16-inch thick. Rolling to this thickness makes these cookies crisp (our preferred texture) rather than soft. If you have any difficulty rolling the dough, place it in the refrigerator to chill for 10-20 minutes and then try again. Use a cookie cutter to cut out as many cookies as you can. Use a metal spatula lightly dusted with arrowroot starch to transfer them onto your parchment-lined baking sheets. Place the cookies about 1 inch apart on the baking sheets. Combine the rest of the dough scraps and repeat steps 5-6 until all of the dough is stamped out into cookies. Bake the cookies for 9-12 minutes until they are dry to the touch. Let cool on the pan for 5-10 minutes before transferring to a cooling rack to cool completely. Enjoy!

Welcoming Recently Arrived Migrants

"The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God." -Leviticus 19:34

The hundreds of migrants who are coming to Denver from the Mexican/US border are current opportunities for faith communities to "welcome the stranger." Among the immediate needs are homes where migrants would find shelter, meals and welcome. A congregation or other faith community might adopt an individual or a family, providing shelter and assistance as the migrants resettle in the Denver area or where they would stay until they are able to travel to friends, relatives or other sponsors in locations throughout the USA. The Journey With Migrants Mission Partnership asks that you or your faith community consider responding to this urgent request for hospitality for newly arrived migrants.

How we might go about providing such hospitality is a question for us all. Fortunately, agencies working to address the needs of the migrants will provide training to help us discern if and how we might respond. This collaborative training, titled *Each One, Welcome One*, will be a webinar held on January 11 6-7:30pm and will provide information to congregants/faith communities who are considering providing shelter and accompaniment to individuals or families who have recently

- <u>Support for Recent Migrants:</u> The City of Denver has informed us that one of the best ways to quickly offer supports to the influx of migrants is to donate to these organizations working directly with them: Colorado Housing Asylum Network; Denver Community Church; Americans Friends Service Committee.
- <u>A Message from the Colorado Council of Churches:</u> The City and County of Denver and the state of Colorado has asked us to help get out the word that they need emergency shelter space for the influx of migrants coming here from mainly Latin American countries. Migrants and asylum seekers have been arriving to Denver from the U.S. southwest border and other cities across the country for several months now, but the numbers we were seeing increased rapidly as of a week ago and continue to stay consistent. We are seeing primarily young men, but we also have women, children, and families present within our shelter system. Most of the children are under age 10. The majority speak Spanish. Our State Officials are asking for help from the Religious Communities in Colorado. To learn how you can help Read more HERE.
- A Special Message from our Partner CHUM Church First Unitarian Society of Denver: Dear 1st Unitarian Denver friends; As of this moment, we have been contacted by the mayor's office and there is a very good chance that 1st Unitarian (FUSD) will be asked to temporarily house up to fifteen of the immigrants who arrived in Denver yesterday. The board has approved this, and we are awaiting further details from the city.

If this happens, we are going to need a significant number of volunteers to help with setting up cots and bedding, making and serving meals, and being on-site to help with whatever comes up, starting Thursday. We will also need a couple organizer-type people to manage scheduling of meals, cleanup, on-site staffing, etc. for the next week or so. We can do this! Please think about what you might be able to offer in terms of time and material/logistical support. More info as soon as we get it. ~Rev. Mike
