

Embracing the Other: The Transformative Spirit of Love - An innovative Asian feminist

perspective on God's Spirit We live in a time of great racial strife and global conflict. How do we work toward healing, reconciliation, and justice among all people, regardless of race or gender? In Embracing the Other Grace Ji-Sun Kim demonstrates that it is possible only through God's



Spirit. Working from a feminist Asian perspective, Kim develops a new constructive global pneumatology that works toward gender and racial-ethnic justice. She draws on concepts from Asian and indigenous cultures to reimagine the divine as "Spirit God" who is restoring shalom in the world. Through the power of Spirit God, Kim says, our brokenness is healed and we can truly love and embrace the Other.

#### The Problem of Wealth: A Christian Response to a Culture of Affluence -

Elizabeth L. Hinson-Hasty is an ordained


Presbyterian pastor, professor, and chair of the theology department at Bellarmine University. She is the author of three previous books: The Problem of Wealth: A Christian Response to a Culture of Affluence (2017), Dorothy Day for Armchair Theologians (2014), and Beyond the



Social Maze: Exploring Vida Dutton Scudder's Theological Ethics (2006).

Bonhoeffer and Climate Change: Theology and Ethics for the Anthropocene - Dianne Rayson addresses the theological and ethical

questions of anthropogenic climate change by engaging the works of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. She dives deep into Bonhoeffer's texts and ecotheological insights, and emerges with an Earthly Christianity for the Anthropocene that is Christological, relational, and steeped in ethical responsibility.
