

On Repentance and Repair: Making Amends in an Unapologetic World - Winner of the



- From the National Wildlife Federation Spring Time is Frog Time! This spring is a great opportunity to look and listen for signs of frogs. Each kind of frog has its own kind of call. So even if you do not see the frog, you can identify them by the sounds they make. Hop on over at this LINK to learn more ideas of how to be a "Frog Scout" in your neighborhood.
- Spring Nature Notebook: One way to make your time outdoors more meaningful is by keeping a Nature Notebook. When scientists, explorers, detectives, writers and artists study in the outdoors they always carry paper or a device to record their findings. It helps them remember their experiences and put their observations in context. Use this LINK to see some ideas to help you get started!
- Spring Bird Migration is in full swing and is expected to peak during the first two weeks in May. It's fun to see "live" (at night) and "last-night" (the next day) radar data on migration at the BirdCast Migration Dashboard. Every year, 3.5 to 4 billions birds migrate and 80% of them migrate at night! In addition to enjoying seeing the birds in flight on the Migration Dashboard and enjoying the new voices joining the "Dawn Chorus" upon their arrival, there are two simple steps we can all take to help out our avian neighbors: (1) Shield outdoor lights to prevent light from being emitted upwards. (2) Turn off lights as early as possible during bird migration seasons (April-May and August-September). You can learn more about the "Lights Out" programs across the State by visiting the following:
