As of June 2023 all masonry work on the tower has been completed! Our roofer was onsite beginning Monday June 26 to begin setting the collector boxes and downspouts. This work is expected to be completed the last week of June and will bring the roofing scope to 100% complete! Our historic building team will have a a site walk in early July to review the work at the belltower and identify a final punchlist of that portion of the project, as necessary.

The next stage of the project will be the work on our west side stained glass. Our stained glass crew is working diligently to finish a stain glass project at DU and should be wrapped up this week. The Capitol Heights Community is their next home. Once the stained glass crew start at the church they will remain on our job until it is completed.

More about Project Worthmore and the International Community they serve: Colorado is home to over 60,000 refugees. Since 2009, the team at Project Worthmore has worked to respond to the direct needs of this community as they navigate a completely new life. Every family served has a unique story, a steadfast courage, and a resilience to survive and rebuild their lives here in the Centennial State.

A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee their country because of persecution, war or violence. An estimated 60,000 people who have fled their home countries now call Colorado home. They came to this country as refugees, and from the day they arrive, they are challenged to forge a new life, pay rent within the first few months of arrival, adapt to a new culture, learn English, and navigate complex networks of public services and administration. The very first thing a refugee owns upon entering the USA is debt: They all must reimburse the cost of their plane tickets, a substantial financial burden, especially for large families.

Before arriving in Colorado, our clients lived all over the world. We serve refugees from over 25 countries who come from diverse cultures and backgrounds, and bring unique skills and perspectives to our community. - The Dream Center at 2165 Curtis St. Coordinated drop offs are being accepted Monday to Thursday between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. in the front loading zone of the building. Donations can also be dropped off at the small parking lot next to the building. Denverites can email info@denverdc.org to schedule a drop off.
- ➤ First Baptist Church at 1373 Grant Street (One of our CHUM partners) The Interfaith Alliance of Colorado is taking donations beginning May 25. Drop offs can only be made Thursdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- Servicios de la Raza at 3131 W. 14th Ave. Non-perishable food donations can be made at the nonprofit's building Monday to Thursday from 1 to 4 p.m.

- <u>Rice and Beans Report from our June Social Service Sunday:</u> Our inter-faith communities had a wonderful time working together on our June 25th *Social Service Sunday*. A ton (seriously a ton, 2,000 lbs!) of rice and beans were broken down from large bags into smaller ones that will be distributed at MetroCaring. Our helpers ranged from under 8 to over 80 and shared tasks such as carrying heavy boxes, emptying the large bags into containers for distribution, labeling all the bags with the date, filling smaller bags, providing refreshments, and clean up. Gene was back at the building again on Wednesday June 28th to meet the good folks from MetroCaring who collected the fruit of y'alls hard work. Thank you to all our participants!
