Building News

Denver Water was hard at work on October 11th replacing the lead pipe that provides water to our church building! Denver Water recommends that church users continue using the filtered water pitcher provided by Denver Water for the next 4 - 6 months to give time for any remaining lead residue to clear out from the pipes. As an extra precaution, the church will have our water tested after the 4 - 6 month period (close to Easter) before lifting the advice to use filtered water for drinking and cooking.





The lower tier West Façade Stained Glass windows now have new 1/4 inch tempered glass installed. This glass will provide the windows more protection from the elements and vandalism. Much of the cleaning and glass repair on the long portion of the lower windows is complete and the operable small windows will soon be reinstalled. We are grateful to Moises of Watkins Stained Glass for his many hours of work on repairing our historic stained glass windows.

The New York Times recently published an article on how to navigate 8 common illnesses. Here is a quick reference summary. To see the full article by Dana G. Smith, "Am I Still Contagious?", click HERE.

Am I Still Contagious?

Consult this quick guide whenever someone in your family is sick.



Cold

Mild symptoms, including runny nose and congestion. Most contagious on Days 2 and 3.



Hand, foot & mouth disease

Rash, mouth sores, fever. Most contagious while symptoms are present (a few days to a week).



Conjunctivitis (pink eye)

Itchy, red, weepy eyes. Highly contagious for a few days to a couple weeks, if you get it in both eyes.



Norovirus

Diarrhea and vomiting. Symptoms last 24 to 48 hours, but you can be contagious for weeks.



Covid-19

Congestion, fatigue, cough, sore throat. Most contagious through Day 5.



R.S.V.

Severe coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath. Most contagious on Days 1 to 5.



Flu

Sore throat, congestion, fever, aches — all of which come on suddenly. Contagious for about five days.



Strep

Very sore throat, maybe fever. No longer contagious 24 hours after starting antibiotics.
