Driver Overview for Transportation

Thank you for your willingness to provide transportation support for migrant travelers! The current routes for transportation are from the Intake Center at 3815 Steele St. to Union Station. (1701 Wewatta St.) or to the 40th & Colorado RTD Station (4220 Garfield St.). <u>No other destinations are permitted.</u> Google Maps, Apple Maps, and Waze can provide the best route for the time of day. Printed directions will be available at check-in.

Steele Street Check-In

You should park in the small parking area on the Northwest side of the DHS Building at 3815 Steele Street. This is the back side of the building, marked "Entrada" with a street sign. Knock at the double doors off the patio and identify yourself as a driver for transportation. The driver should be prepared to share information about the organization/church making the transport and the number of passengers they can accommodate.

The driver should check in at the Emergency Operations table within the DHS building. Let the EOC staff know that you will coordinate with the transportation liaison, who will determine how best to organize the trip schedule for the day, as well as pair you with a coordinator if necessary. You can expect to handle 3-4 trips during your shift, depending on the traffic in the intake facility.

Union Station Drop Off

The drop off location is 1701 Wewatta (in front of Whole Foods). Your estimated arrival time will be communicated to partner staff at Union Station. They will be there waiting to escort your passengers to the next leg of their journey. It is our intent to not bring individuals back to the Steele location without prior authorization, for the safety of the drivers and coordinators.

40th & Colorado Drop Off

The drop off location is 4220 Garfield St. This drop off is only for travelers headed to Denver International Airport who hold an A line ticket. Passengers can be dropped off in the cul-de-sac next to the station at the end of Jackson St. EOC staff on site will provide special instructions to any passengers being dropped off at this location.
