**Learning about Prairie Dogs** 

February 2nd is officially recognized as Groundhog Day, but here in the West some folks have taken to celebrating *Prairie Dog Day* as well. Prairie Dog Day invites the public to more fully understand prairie dogs and their communities, and learn how the status of prairie dogs affects the health of our western grasslands.

**Prairie Dogs** are considered a **Keystone** Species as their colonies are associated with over 200 vertebrate species and numerous invertebrate species. There are five species of prairie dogs found in North America, ranging from Mexico to Canada, and all belong to the *Scuiridae* (squirrel) family. Their other biological relatives include groundhogs, chipmunks, marmots and woodchucks.

*Historically* it is estimated that a population of more than 5 billion prairie dogs coexisted with 30-60 million bison across the American plains.

They are a *food source* for many animals, including mountain plover, burrowing owl, ferruginous hawks, golden eagle, bald eagle, swift fox and endangered black-footed ferrets to name a few. Many of these species and numerous others also use the prairie dog burrows as homes.

**Prairie dogs help aerate and fertilize** the soil, allowing for a greater diversity of plants to thrive. Their soil aeration helps water from rainfall and snowmelt to percolate into the ground table.
